### **Camp Payment Schedule:**

- \$ February 1 – A \$75 deposit for each reservation is required. **All deposits are nonrefundable and cannot be applied toward balance due.**
- \$ March 31 – A \$50 payment is required. **All deposits are nonrefundable and cannot be applied toward balance due.**
- \$ April 30 – The final \$38 payment for each reservation is required. **All deposits are nonrefundable and cannot be applied toward balance due.**
- \$ By May 1 – **Cancellation Deadline: All cancellations after May 1 will incur an additional \$50.00 fee for each person dropped. When this occurs, deposits cannot be applied toward balance.**

### **Policies to know:**

#### Damages and Keys

Parents are responsible to pay for damages to any facilities or dorm rooms caused by their child as well as any lost keys (Each child will be given his/her own room key). Lost Keys will result in a cost \$10.

#### Cell Phones

Children may not bring Cell Phones to camp. In the event of an emergency a chaperone will contact the child's parents. The Cell Phone numbers of chaperones will be given to parents prior to our departure for camp so that parents can call a chaperone to check on their children.

## What should campers bring?

- Twin sheets or sleeping bag, towels, pillow, blanket
- Clothes that can be worn to recreation and tracks
- Clothes that can get really messy (for OMC and if you plan on taking a messy track)
- Closed toe, closed heel shoes (for outdoor activities)
- Bible, notepad, pen and backpack to carry things in
- Water bottle
- Toiletries (toothpaste, shampoo, etc)
- Sunscreen
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering (see Missions Information below)
- An alarm clock (no cell phones)
- A dark t-shirt if you plan to take tracks including activities with water.
- Modest one-piece bathing suit or two-piece with dark shirt to wear over it.

### **Do not pack:**

- ⊗ Anything that advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs
- ⊗ Anything that explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person
- ⊗ Anything that explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations
- ⊗ Excessively short or tight fitting clothing
- ⊗ Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, or any kind of weapon
- ⊗ Radios, iPods, CD players, roller blades, skateboards, cell phones, or water guns
- ⊗ Anything that calls attention to underwear (sagging pants, rolling down waistband, etc.)

## Missions:

### **Our Focus:**

**Romany people in Central and Eastern Europe** (International Mission Board) - The Romany people are largest people group without their own country in Europe. They are the most discriminated against population in the world. [www.romaministries.com/](http://www.romaministries.com/)

**Canada** (North American Mission Board) - Work alongside Current Canada, a summer missions program allowing students who have completed the 11th grade or higher to experience hands-on ministry in remote areas of Canada where there is little to no evangelical presence. ### **What can you and your child do now?**

**Pray:** Pray now for the Romany people and Canada. Pray about the offering your child should give.

**Give:** A missions offering will be collected at camp on Thursday night.

**Go:** Missions opportunities are available for families with children of all ages.

### **Deciding what to Give:**

**Providing for the Roma:** A Bible in the Polish language cost is \$9.00 each (There are no Roma Bibles in the dialects we work with here in Poland). Bible story books \$8. Children's school supplies for a family of 4 children: \$500. Multivitamins to aid in prevention of malnutrition: \$75 per month per family. Dental care for a family of 4 children: \$350 a year. Coal for heating and cooking costs \$700 for 2 metric tons. (This will last all year for an average family). A loaf of bread: \$2. A kilo of chicken meat: \$3. A kilo of rice \$1.50.

**Providing for Canada:** \$25 - winter gear for church planter or family member (hat, gloves, scarf). \$40 - winter boots for church planter or family member. \$250 - will buy 600 water bottles for evangelistic outreach project for new church. \$100 - will buy fabric to make costumes for Children's Christmas Outreach. \$25 - dinner for outreach dinner/bible study on university campus. \$100 - care package for church planting family (videos, snacks, books, small toy for children).

## Complete “What It Looks Like” Detailed Guide

### Opening Day

**1:00-4:00 pm Registration** - Upon arrival on campus, one group leader will register the group while campers (accompanied by other adults) will choose track times, get t-shirts, and then the entire FBC group will reunite for a CK group picture. Group photos must be ordered on Monday. They are \$6. We will then get everyone settled in their rooms and enjoy free time before Dinner.

**5:30 Dinner** - In the Mississippi College cafeteria.

**6:30 Opening Activities** - This includes:

Opening Celebration: an all-camp gathering in the auditorium to get kids excited about the week and introduce our theme. Bible study for campers with CentriKid staffer while adults meet together to discuss the details of the week in the auditorium. Party: which is a high-energy closing to each night of camp that may include games, drama, etc. Church Group Devotion: time to talk about what God is doing each day and to set a goal for the mission offering. Free Time: time to get a snack, hang out with other campers and the CK staff, get showers, etc.

**7:30 am Breakfast**

**8:30 Quiet Time w/Church Group** - Time to have a quiet time in the morning before the craziness of camp begins. Your child will receive a devotional guide for this time on Monday. They will be able to go through the devotion on their own, teaching them how to have a quiet time when they leave camp.

**9:00 I Can't Wait . . .** - An exciting, energy-driven programming element to wake campers up and get them ready for a day of camp. This will also include announcements for campers.

**9:30 Bible Study/Recreation**

**Bible Study: *Bon Appetit :: God's Recipe for Your Life***

**Opening Day :: Who am I?** We are called to be children of God. He has called us out of the world and called us to be His. On this night, we'll lay the foundation for our study throughout the week.

**Day 1 :: I am Adopted** Today, we'll take a look at David's adoption of Solomon's son, Mephibosheth. This adoption was completely as a result of David's unmerited generosity towards the family of Jonathan. Likewise, because of Christ, God has graciously adopted us as His children, even when we did nothing to earn it. He has given us all the rights and benefits of children of God.

**Day 2 :: I am Being Changed** Today, we'll take a look at one of the most changed lives in all of Scripture...Simon Peter. Because of His relationship with Jesus, Peter's life was changed in almost every way. We'll look at what it means to be a new creation because of our relationship with Christ.

**Day 3 :: I am Unique** Today, we're going to take a look at the life of one of the heroes of the Old Testament...Joseph. This was a kid who was unique in many ways: he was favored by his father; he had strange dreams; he wore a colorful coat, etc. Yet, because of his relationship with God, he was confident in who he was and who he was made to be.

**Closing Day :: Go and Do Likewise** We want to challenge campers to go back to "normal" life and to live as ambassadors for Christ. By living a life in line with God's Word, we spread His love through our world back home.

**Recreation:**

Rec is a time daily to play outdoor team-building games within the camper's team. It's high-energy and **requires closed-toe shoes**. **OMC:** Rec on Thursdays. OMC stands for Organized Mass Chaos, and that is exactly what it is. Every player knows exactly what task he is doing, but each player in the game is doing some thing different. Players attempt to complete as many tasks as possible (one task at a time), but players are interrupted to help other players complete their tasks during the game.

For recreation, each grade's team will have a color: **3rd grade: yellow, 4th grade: green, 5th grade: blue, and 6th grade: red**

Campers are encouraged to wear their grade's color for OMC.

**10:50 - Recreation/Bible Study****12:00 pm - Lunch****1:15 - Track A**

Campers will choose from the list of tracks on Monday during Registration. They will select their top five and will get one of their choices for Track A and one for Track B. All five should be choices that the camper would enjoy, as they could get their fifth choice. They will participate in the same track Tuesday,

Wednesday, and Thursday. It may be good to let your child think about track choices, but please don't choose tracks before you arrive. Let the CentriKid staff explain these in full upon arrival at camp before your child chooses. Tracks are subject to availability. **Tracks:** Archery, Around the World (Missions Track), Arts & Crafts, Babysitting 101, Basketball, Cheernastics, Drama, Flag Football, Foot Praise (dance), Kitchen Chaos, No Boys Allowed, Outdoor Games, Praise Team (with percussion), Sign Language, Soccer, Splish Splash, Tennis, Volleyball, Weird Science, and Wet & Wild.

**2:45 - Track B****4 pm - Hang Time**

Time set aside in the afternoon before dinner for staff and adults to hang out with kids as they go to the camp store, swim in the pool, play Frisbee on the quad, etc.

Options Include: Swim in Alumni Pool, Outdoor games like Frisbee, kickball, etc., Girl Time: painting nails, doing hair, etc, Playing basketball, ping pong, swim at the Healthplex, visit the CentriKid Store, etc.
